Mr. Bozeman explained the process for election of officers. Tommy Campbell was the only nomination for Chairman.

By motion of Dr. Heinrich and second by Mr. Lindsey, the Commission unanimously voted in favor that Mr. Tommy Campbell be the Chairman of the Commission.

Dr. Roger Heinrich was the only nomination for Vice Chairman.

By motion of Councilman Martin and second by Mr. Lindsey, the Commission voted in favor that Dr. Roger Heinrich be the Vice Chairman of the Commission.

2. Consider minutes of the June 24, 2019 meeting

The minutes of the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission meeting held on June 24, 2019 were presented for approval.

Councilman Martin made a motion to approve, seconded by Dr. Heinrich. The motion passed.

3. Recognize new member Jason Schmitt who replaces Brian Patterson

Chair Campbell welcomed and introduced Jason Schmitt, the newest Commission member, who replaces Brian Patterson. Mr. Schmitt thanked the Commission and looks forward working with everyone.

4. Presentation of Awards

Chair Campbell and Mr. Bozeman presented staff with recent government television programming awards from the National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (NATOA).

John Padgett Awards of Honor for “Innovative Use of Video” on Barfield Crescent Park and “Public Service Announcement” on the Discovery Center
Steve Burris Award of Honor for “Live Community Event Coverage” on Wedding Dresses at Oaklands Mansion

Michael Linn White Award of Honor for “Profile of a Person” on Noah Gaines

The entire staff Award of Honor for “Use of Social Media Platforms”

Michael Nevills Award of Distinction for “Public Safety” on the City Emergency Preparedness video

Alan Bozeman recipient the 2019 “Brian Wilson Memorial Award for Programming Excellence”

Chair Campbell along with all Commission members congratulated staff on these acolytes.

5. Staff Reports and Other Business

Mr. Bozeman provided information on CityTV social media viewership numbers during 2019. He stated the City YouTube channel had 174,082 total views of videos for the year, Facebook had 473,200, the city website had 2,828. He also went through some of the top programs viewed on each of the platforms.

Mr. Nevills discussed the new podcast feature CityTV was providing. He said the idea originated by staff interest in doing a podcast as well as discussions with Public Information Director Mike Browning. Browning approached Mr. Nevills in January 2020 on a topic that would be ideal for a pilot episode – schedule and route changes for Rover. Mr. Nevills added staff would also shoot video of the podcast to use on City TV, YouTube and Facebook (to maximize the opportunity). The hosting service Podbean was chosen for the audio of the podcast. Staff recently shot a second episode that debuted the first of March with Interim Planning Director Greg McKnight discussing economic development projects. Mr. Nevills stated the goal of staff was to produce a podcast every month. Mr. Nevills added staff would look at additional sites like Spotify and Apple Podcasts to include their audio podcasts.

Mr. Bozeman reported that all Comcast complaints received have been addressed by Comcast or by staff. Mr. Bozeman provide a breakdown of all the Comcast Cable Television complaints recieved by the city during 2019 with the majority of those being billing issues.

Mr. Bozeman stated the local Comcast cable television franchise agreement only has a few deal points remaining to agree to and once completed will be ready for review by the Commission and City Council.

There being no other business to come before the Commission, Chair Campbell declared the meeting adjourned.

WHEREAS, Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) has one (1) PEG channel which is used primarily by the students in the Mass Communication Department of MTSU; and

WHEREAS, MTSU proposes to offer telecourses to students in the Middle Tennessee area via cable television and has requested a second PEG channel; and

WHEREAS, the franchise agreement with Robin Media Group Inc., dba Intermedia provides for two (2) PEG channels for MTSU, subject to rules and regulations approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission considers a PEG channel to be a valuable asset of the community that should be utilized for the public good and therefore is willing to only grant a second PEG channel to MTSU conditionally as set forth below herein.

ORDER

This matter came on for consideration on the 9th day of November 1998 before the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission upon the request of MTSU for a second PEG channel. Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was

RESOLVED to grant MTSU a second PEG channel effective January 1, 1999, subject to evaluation of MTSU's use of both PEG channels for the public good, consideration of signal quality, and other relevant factors relating thereto. The CATV Commission will make its evaluation of MTSU's use of both channels in May 1999

following a public hearing and annually thereafter. The license of the second PEG channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following any annual review following a public hearing. This Order 98-03 is subject to the approval of the Murfreesboro City Council; further review by the Cable Television Commission at its December 1998 meeting; and to acceptance of its terms by Middle Tennessee State University.

WHEREAS, MTSU proposes to offer telecourses to students in the Middle Tennessee area via cable television and has requested a second PEG channel; and

WHEREAS, the franchise agreement with Robin Media Group Inc., dba Intermedia provides for two (2) PEG channels for MTSU, subject to rules and regulations approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission considers a PEG channel to be a valuable asset of the community that should be utilized for the public good and therefore is willing to only grant a second PEG channel to MTSU conditionally as set forth below herein.

ORDER

This matter came on for consideration on the 9th day of November 1998 before the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission upon the request of MTSU for a second PEG channel. Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was

RESOLVED to grant MTSU a second PEG channel effective January 1, 1999, subject to evaluation of MTSU's use of both PEG channels for the public good, consideration of signal quality, and other relevant factors relating thereto. The CATV Commission will make its evaluation of MTSU's use of both channels in May 1999

following a public hearing and annually thereafter. The license of the second PEG channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following any annual review following a public hearing. This Order 98-03 is subject to the approval of the Murfreesboro City Council; further review by the Cable Television Commission at its December 1998 meeting; and to acceptance of its terms by Middle Tennessee State University.

Mission Statement of True Blue TV

True Blue TV, the education resource channel of Middle Tennessee, is Murfreesboro and Rutherford County's educational access cable Channel 9/1096. True Blue TV's mission is to produce high quality video programs of educational merit for our viewers; present outstanding academic events that enhance the University's mission to educate a diverse student body, foster lifelong learning across Tennessee, and produce unique programming to enhance K-12 education and teacher professional development. True Blue TV similarly locates external sources of programming that support the University's mission to promote openness and be of service to the community. The channel strives to deliver all of its programming via technologically appropriate, high quality, and cost effective venues.

Criterion 1 – Public Good

*The channel will serve the citizens of Murfreesboro and the university community with educational, informational, and entertainment programming.

True Blue TV continued to serve the citizens of Murfreesboro and the university community in 2019 by producing unique educational, informational and entertainment programming that enhances K-12 education and teacher professional development, informs the MTSU university community and offers lifelong learning for communities in middle Tennessee; to create and produce high quality video programs of educational merit; and to record outstanding academic events that enhance the University's mission to educate a diverse student body. By meeting these goals, True Blue TV continues to increase the programming choices available to Rutherford County cable subscribers. Programming includes topics of interest to specific viewers (K-12 teachers and students, MTSU faculty and students, etc.) as well as programs with broad appeal to the Rutherford County community (music concerts, Middle Tennessee history, Tennessee outdoors and wildlife, informative programs about national and world events, etc.).

True Blue TV also seeks to serve the public good by instituting Closed Captioning on station programming to increase accessibility and has exceeded our target of 50% for 2019 by having 60% of our airing shows captioned. TBTv achieved this by creating a captioning unit staffed by student workers, and articulating our programming requirements for captioning to our vendors, distributors and partners.

Criterion 2 – Signal Quality

*The channels will maintain a signal quality comparable to other access channels on the Murfreesboro cable system.

True Blue TV, the education resource channel of Middle Tennessee, strives to maintain the highest signal quality possible for cable subscribers. New HD Digital satellite receivers now provide access and improved signal quality to the Classic Arts Showcase and NASA TV which provide programming for the station from midnight until 6:00am. The new Satellite equipment was put in service during summer 2016. Upgrades were added to Satellite equipment in fall 2018.

We continue to serve the Murfreesboro and Rutherford County communities, in addition to Cannon and DeKalb Counties and parts of Rutherford, Wilson, Smith and White Counties through a partnership with DTC Television. A partnership with United Communications allows us to offer programming in Chapel Hill Tennessee and other surrounding communities. We added AT&T U-verse customers in Middle Tennessee to our viewership through a partnership between MTSU and AT&T.

Maintaining and/or improving our signal quality is a high priority for True Blue TV. All of our equipment has now been upgraded. We regularly review our equipment infrastructure to ensure that we have installed all current updates. Our recently installed fiber transceivers between MTSU's campus and Comcast's head end are working at optimal efficiency with the latest technology which provides a clearer, more stable feed. Our fiber equipment now has an HD signal. When Comcast moves us into one of the HD channels, our HD equipment will deliver the highest quality that PEG broadcasting can offer. True Blue TV has also collaborated with MTSU Audio Visual Services to deliver closed captioning on the signal as often as possible.

Criterion 3 – Other Relevant Factors

*The channels will adhere to the mission statements of the University, the Center for Educational Media, and the College of Mass Communication with the Department of Electronic Media Communication as a subunit of the College.

True Blue TV, the education resource channel of Middle Tennessee (TBTv), adheres to the mission statement of Middle Tennessee State University and the Center for Educational Media in the following ways:

- On a daily basis, True Blue TV expands the reach of the university at the local and regional levels, and we have developed the capacity to expand university outreach both nationally and globally through our satellite and streaming initiatives.

Other Relevant Factors continued;

- True Blue TV supports MTSU's efforts to generate and disseminate knowledge and innovation through media production and broadcast of high quality educational and community programming, including K-12 professional development and enriching programs for lifelong learners. True Blue TV and CEM also collaborate with the Albert Gore Research Center to preserve videos through maintaining video archives.
- True Blue TV is broadening our capacity to serve the diverse student population at MTSU by enhancing their access to information through closed captioning and audio description services. CEM is an active participant in the university's efforts to expand information accessibility to disabled populations. CEM is a key player in facilitating closed captioning and audio description services for the university community in alignment with the MTSU Access Initiative.
- True Blue TV develops and sustains academic partnerships supporting the creative activity of faculty at MTSU through broadcasting original programming such as "Portraits: The First Black American Divas of Song and Opera" (Art, Music, Dance, Theatre at MTSU, musical performance, history) and the MTSU Honors College Lecture Series (Honors College, guest speakers, current topics of interest)
- True Blue TV partners with faculty to support community outreach by broadcasting programming produced by CEM in collaboration with the MTSU American Democracy Project including "Suffrage and Citizenship", an expert panel for U.S. Constitution Day, and "The Free Exercise Thereof: An Interfaith Panel" with community religious leaders during MT Engage.

How many hours of new locally produced/non-repeat educational programming on channel 9 were provided to Murfreesboro cable subscribers during 2019? What were some of these programs?

TBTv produced and broadcast **165** television programs in 2019, totaling **169.2** hours. Programs were not only designed for K-12 teachers and classrooms, but included recordings of guest presentations and events at MTSU that TBTv was able to bring to the Murfreesboro and Rutherford County communities. All programs had broad appeal and educational potential for multiple categories of viewers. These programs were produced and distributed in collaboration with public and private partners, including MTSU faculty and staff. Our partners include the American Democracy Project; the Center for Accelerated Language Acquisition (CALA); the Middle Tennessee Writing Project; Art, Theatre, Dance, Music at Middle Tennessee; MTSU Honors College; the Heritage Center of Murfreesboro and Rutherford County; Murfreesboro City Schools; Rutherford County Schools; the Tennessee Center for the Study and Treatment of Dyslexia; Tennessee Holocaust Commission; The College of Liberal Arts; F.I.R.E. Institute; MTSU News and Media Relations; MTSU Office of Marketing and Communications; The College of Basic and Applied Sciences, and EYH “Expanding Your Horizons” in Science and Mathematics Conference managed by MTSU’s Women in STEM Center. Most of our program partners are planning to participate in programming with us again in 2020.

We distribute MTSU Out of the Blue to NewsChannel 5+ in Nashville and our broadcast partners. Through PEGMedia, we offer MTSU Out of the Blue and several of our other productions including, The Great Tennessee Eclipse, MT Conversations, The Iron Furnace Trail, The Greatest Songs You May Never Hear and Songspeak to PEG stations around the country. To date, we have on record **465** downloads by **42** stations from **17** states (CA, CT, GA, ID, IL, IN, LA, MA, ME, MI, NC, NE, PA, SC, TN, TX, and WI) of MTSU Out of the Blue through PEGMedia. Also through PEGMedia, our other 50+ productions have been downloaded to date, **3084** times by **277** stations in **42** states, the District of Columbia, and Cape Town South Africa. (AK, AL, AR, AZ, CA, CO, CT, FL, GA, ID, IA, IL, IN, KS, LA, MA, MD, ME, MI, MN, MO, MT, NC, ND, NE, NH, NJ, NV, NY, OH, OK, OR, PA, SC, SD, TN, TX, VA, VT, WA, WI, WV).

Through TelVue ® Connect™ Media Exchange we share locally produced programs in HD to stations nationwide. Downloaded for later airings were TBTv series including, “MT Conversations”, “Out of the Blue”, “Portraits: The First Black American Divas of Song and Opera”, Teachers Talk and the “Great Tennessee Eclipse from MTSU”. All programs have been downloaded a total of **108** times by **50** community stations across **17** states including Mississippi.

What new, if any, non-locally produced programming are being planned for during 2020?

We continue to work with the commercial educational video distributors from whom we licensed programming in 2019. We anticipate that the number of programs we will be able to license in 2020 will continue to be fewer than in 2019 due to budget constraints. Distributors include: Ambrose Video, Bullfrog Films, Chip Taylor Communications, Connect TelVue, Films Ideas, Green Planet Films, PEG Media, and Soundview Media.

How many months out of the year is Channel 9 programming locally produced educational content?

Locally produced educational programming for K-12 students and faculty, as well as other programming for Channel 9, are being produced year round.

What new locally produced programs or initiatives took place with channel 9 during 2019 and are being planned for 2020 for the Murfreesboro cable subscribers' benefit?

Locally produced programs and initiatives that will be continued in 2020 include:

- Partnering with **MTSU Marketing and Communications** to producing a series of special "Out of the Blue" reports called "#Stay the Course" to help with student guidance and transitions related to the Covid-19 pandemic,
- Continued partnership with **Professional Educators of Tennessee** on "Leader U", a one day professional development workshop for Tennessee educators with notable teachers and applicable subject matter.
- Working with the **MTSU Center for the Study and Treatment of Dyslexia** to broadcast special events including the highly successful Zoom webcast of the "Fox Reading Conference".
- Producing recorded and live professional development programming for teachers of English Language Learners in partnership with the **MTSU ELL Teachers Collaborative**.
- Partnering with **MTSU's Free Speech Center** and Ken Paulson to film interviews with individuals on the front lines of 1st Amendment advocacy in the U.S., as well as produce promotional material on this new and growing facet of our University.
- Partnering with the **MTSU Honors College** and **MTSU's Political Economy Research Institute** to air lectures in celebration of the life of MTSU alumni, and Murfreesboro native, Nobel Prize winner James Buchanan on the anniversary of his 100th birthday this past October.
- Partnering with **MTSU Alumni Association** to produce an ongoing series targeting alumni on relative life coaching issues and other matters such as retirement, successful job hunting, and team building.

Additional initiatives to be continued in 2020:

In alignment with MTSU's ongoing commitment to improving access for all individuals under the Americans with Disabilities Act, True Blue TV has developed a functioning unit to implement closed captioning on the cable channel utilizing student workers and specialized software. This unit enables the station to close caption its own productions and more easily obtain closed caption files from distributors, thus enhancing our service to viewers who would benefit from active accommodation.

True Blue TV remains committed to better serving Murfreesboro cable subscribers by providing program information to Comcast for inclusion on their electronic guide. Comcast has been a great help in attempting to provide such service, performing tests and research. Augmenting the initiative is the mtsu.edu/truebluetv website which houses a weekly programming guide and a live stream of the channel.

Continued growth of the CEM Professional Development Center has afforded True Blue TV the opportunity to expand our locally produced, original educational programming. In 2019, CEM/CPD hosted nineteen K-12 professional development conferences with almost 2000 Tennessee educators in attendance, much of which was recorded and will be broadcast on True Blue TV in 2020.

This year marked the first time the TBTv was able to broadcast live two events held by the **MTSU ELL Teacher's Collaborative** as they occurred. Plans are underway to incorporate future live broadcasts as part of the station's educational professional development offerings.

From a technical standpoint, how is the channel monitored and what procedures are in place to respond to technical issues, such as the channel being off the air and in black or frozen for extended periods of time?

The station is continuously monitored during business hours by monitors located in offices of key personnel and on a display in the public lobby area. In addition the Engineering core room houses monitoring for the Comcast return and is checked periodically during the day. The fiber optic send to Comcast is also monitored periodically during the day. Alarms, low quality, or interruptions in the signal, are reported to the TBTv Senior Manager and the Assistant Engineer. They notify the Chief Engineer and work with Comcast services to rectify the issue.

During evening hours the TBTv Senior Manager spot checks the station via a home Xfinity subscription, ROKU express, Apple TV, Amazon FIRE TV, and the internet. In the event of a technical issue a remote desktop link is established to the video server and corrections are made. The server itself is configured to broadcast the "Total Info" service when detecting a lost or corrupted video file. In the event of a power outage the Learning Resources Center building is equipped with emergency generators and the TBTv video center in the LRC is equipped with battery backup utilities.

Fall 2020 Semester

MT10 began a full schedule of student-produced programming. The station also purchased equipment to produce high quality shows remotely from various locations to allow even more programs, produced in a health-conscious manner.

- **Newscast** – Two live newscast a week on Monday Night and Thursday Night at 6:30 pm
 - 9 weeks of these newscast which works out to 18 live newscasts produced this semester
- **The Rise** – Recorded every other Monday Night to be broadcasted during the off week of recording
 - 4 Episodes are planned to be broadcasted for this semester
- **The Wave** – Recorded every Tuesday night to be broadcasted on Sundays
 - 8 Episodes of this music show are planned to be broadcasted during this semester
- **The Turn** – Recorded every other Wednesday Night to be broadcasted during the off week of recording
 - 5 Episodes of this improv/comedy show are planned to be broadcasted this semester
- **Sound Off** – Recorded every other Thursday Night to be broadcasted on the off week of recording

- 4 Episodes of this music game show are planned to be broadcasted this semester
- **Election 2020** (Nov.3) – Channel 10 is planning to cover the Presidential Election in November
 - We plan on doing live, hourly hits this night to provide the city with live, unbiased coverage of the presidential election
- **Murfreesboro Christmas Parade** – We are planning on producing this event again in December
 - One of the most popular things we do as a television station
 - We plan on broadcasting live on the channel and Facebook for this event
 - The 2019 Parade went over very well and was a live production as well
- **Out of the Blue** - monthly MTSU Marketing and Communications Public Affairs

Station Restructure

The Department of Media Arts has served as the source of faculty advisement and facilities for the student station since its inception. The station has been classified as a “Student Organization and Service” funded by Student Activity fees and managed and staffed by students as an extracurricular student club

In order to provide more oversight and guidance for the channel, which the City of Murfreesboro grants the University each year, the department is planning a restructuring.

The Department of Media Arts is comprised of five programs: Video and Film, Animation, Photography, Interactive Media and Media Management. As part of curricular upgrades, each program is mandating a required senior course called a “Capstone Project”. This essentially is a senior portfolio project. All of the creative programs easily provide for a year-long senior project. “Media Management” is a degree program concentration which teaches students how to serve in managerial positions for various media types such as radio stations, production companies, television stations, corporate media departments and the like.

Our plan for the Fall of 2021, is make the management positions of MT10 channel be Capstone Courses for Seniors in the Media Management program. Those students would serve as General Manager, Programming Manager, Promotion Manager, Social Media Manager etc. They would be supervised and taught by a Media Management faculty-members and be graded for their work.

We feel this would give the station more guidance and attention and be a part of the curriculum. The Department Chair, College Dean, the Director of Student Organizations and the Vice President of Student Affairs support this change.

We would change what has been known as the MT10 student organization, funded by student fees, into another organization. The working title would be “MT10 Productions” – a student program production organization. This student club would focus on making programs instead of managing a television station. They could make programs for MT10 or True Blue TV or Facebook or YouTube or other outlets. MT10 could choose to accept and air those programs as well as programs from other student television stations around the country and from MTSU television production classes. This new production company would be run by students and funded by student fees.

We feel this change will improve the output and management of the channel and better serve the students, the College, The University, the City Cable Commission and the community.
